The program will feature a dynamic presentation from Marsha Kline Pruett. She is a licensed clinical psychologist and the Maconda Brown O'Connor Professor at Smith College School for Social Work. She is researcher, mediator, and consultant to couples, attorneys, and judges. Dr. Kline Pruett has a national reputation for the development, implementation, and evaluation of preventive interventions in courts and family-focused community agencies. She has written extensively for academic and lay audiences.

This presentation lays out the historical basis for the young children and overnights controversy, beginning with the early research and attachment theory. She will share research that bears directly and indirectly on the issues for decision makers. A grid is introduced that unifies different theoretical viewpoints, informed by empirical evidence and illustrated by a case. Finally, a follow-up chart that provides guiding questions for increasing (step-ups) parenting time will be presented and discussed. The audience will have opportunity to think about the grid and chart in relation to their own cases and ask questions to better understand how to utilize them to make changes tied to family strengths and questions of child and family “readiness”.

The seminar will also feature judges and court commissioners from 6 counties and a mock hearing on the legal issues surrounding the challenges with young children and overnight placement schedule. This program promises to give this important topic a rigorous and balanced discussion by all professions with a stake in the outcome. The information and perspectives from this program is sure to aid each professional in this difficult area for years ahead.
